- **What have you accomplished?**
 - We took 6 youth volunteers to the Capitol on February 10th to participate in the page program. We hosted a hearing yesterday and had 31 youth volunteers attend. We heard two cases for 8th grade boys vaping at school. Our Teen Court Scholarship application will open tomorrow for any seniors who participated in Teen Court this year, we'll award at least one \$1,000 scholarship.

- Substance use prevention curriculum, social norming initiatives and parental engagement
- **What have you accomplished?**
 - We participated in a vape compliance check with the 6 vape shops in the County. 2 out of the 6 sold to our youth inspector. And we are the first County in WV to do compliance check with the vape shops. We will continue with the State Wide SYNAR inspections this spring/fall. Sue will be looking into policy surrounding vape stores, specifically the distance from a school and the amount within a municipality, if anyone wants/can help with that effort please let her know. We are hosting a parent survey to gain insight on parental disapproval of youth substance use. The survey is open from March 5th to April 5th and we'll be doing a drawing for a 55" TV. A flyer is attached with the notes. The BOE will be receiving Juul settlement funding which they want to use for vaping prevention, Sue is meeting with them this week to discuss ideas.

- **What have you accomplished?**
 - Josh Richardson has volunteered to be the new committee chair for Intervention & Recovery. this committee. We hosted our annual Law Enforcement Appreciation event on January 9th and had around 27 officers attend. Save A Life Day will be held on September 14th, a flyer is attached with the minutes.

Treatment options in Fayette County

New River Health 304-469-2905

- Providing MAT and there currently is no waiting list. Medications include Suboxone. The program requires 4 hours of weekly meetings, behavioral health once a month, random drug screens, and visiting NRHA once a week.

FMRS 304-574-2100

- Providing Substance Use Disorder Therapy with two full time therapists. As of right now there are no in person group therapy, only individual. Medication Assisted Therapy include Suboxone, and Vivitrol. We also offer outpatient services, Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) medication, Alcohol withdraw, and Medication Assisted Treatment Access for Rural Appalachians (MARA) which is a wraparound service providing case management and transportation. Also, the Beckley Treatment Center does provide services for Fayette County residents. They offer counseling and medications include Suboxone, Vivitrol and Methadone.

Fayette County Health Department 304-574-1617

- Harm Reduction – Wednesdays from 1-4pm at the Health Department or by appointment. The mobile unit is in Smithers and Page every other Thursdays. Applying for licensure to do Harm Reduction in Smithers through the mobile unit and potentially to other communities.

Breakthru 304-860-8183

- Providing Medical Management Withdraw from Opioid, Benzodiazepine, and Alcohol. Located within Plateau Medical Center, participants stay on average 3-5 days in a private room within the hospital. The program has around 2-3 participants each week and participants receive an after care plan prior to leaving. They accept Medicare, Medicaid and commercial insurance plans.

Veltex 681-422-3338

- Medication Assisted Therapy include Vivitrol and Buprenorphine. Offering female only residential treatment facility, located in Mt. Hope.

Generations Health & Wellness 681-823-4257

- Currently housed in Oak Hill, offering counseling, urgent care and primary care services. Open every day throughout the week

Spero Health 304-503-7310

- Located in Beckley and Princeton, they offer comprehensive outpatient care with physician services, counseling and peer recovery support for those suffering from Substance Use Disorder. Medications include Vivitrol and Sublocade. We are open Monday-Friday, accepts Medicaid.

Anchor Medical 304-253-5155

- Offering primary care and Substance Use Disorder using MAT. Patients can receive care, counseling and treatment all in one visit. Medications include Suboxone and Vivitrol. We are also working on providing Hep C treatments and HIV prevention. We offer telehealth options.

LEAD – Jenny Perry 304-923-3318

- Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) is a pre-booking program aimed at redirecting low-level offenders engaged in drug or prostitution activities to available community services.

Seed Sower 304-392-5464

- 16 bed, female residential recovery treatment center in Greenbrier County. A women and children's recovery treatment center will open in Montgomery, hopefully in April.
