


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About the FRN

The Fayette County Family Resource Network (FRN) is a State Funded grant, providing in-direct services to the residents of Fayette County, West Virginia. There are 47 FRNs serving all 55 counties in West Virginia. The Fayette FRN is a local non-profit and provides fiscal agent services to other organizations or programs.

Our mission is to strengthen individuals, families, and communities through education, mobilization, resource development, inter-agency coordination, strategic planning, needs assessments, and ongoing evaluation of services.

As a network of community members and agencies providing services, the FRN brings opportunities for everyone to come together in monthly meetings. Outside of monthly meetings, we seek funding to support community projects, assist education and prevention programs, and maintain network communication.

The FRN is operated under a Board of Directors. The Board of Directors is comprised of local individuals who are tasked with ensuring the FRN is serving the children and families.
